Archarcharch bounces back, beats J P's Gusto in Southwest

After a disappointing effort in the fog in the Smarty Jones Stakes, Archarcharch made amends with a one-length score at odds of 14.50-to-1 in the \$250,000 Southwest Stakes on Monday at Oaklawn Park.

The three-year-old colt by Arch, sire of 2010 Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) winner and champion older male Blame, spurred clear in the stretch of the one-mile race and held off a late surge from Grade 1 winner J P's Gusto to prevail in 1:38.23 on a track rated as fast.

Jinks Fires trains Archarcharch for owner Robert Yagos, who purchased him for \$60,000 from the consignment of Paramount Sales, agent, at the 2009 Keeneland September yearling sale. Bred in Kentucky by Grapestock, Archarcharch is out of Grade 2-placed winner Woodman's Dancer, by Woodman, and is a half brother to stakes winner Run Sully Run. His second dam is 1988 Hollywood Oaks (G1) winner Pattern Step, by Nureyev.

Archarcharch finished second in his career debut in November at Churchill Downs before a convincing win in the Sugar Bowl Stakes on December 18 at Fair Grounds. He lost a little of that shine with a fourth-place finish, beaten by 13/4 lengths, in the Smarty Jones on January 17 at Oaklawn but rebounded powerfully in his graded stakes debut in the Southwest.

'He was a different horse today,' Yagos said. 'He was a little rank [in the Smarty Jones] and he's a horse who wants to sit off the pace a little bit, so when he got pushed around a little bit he got keyed up and put himself on the lead. On that track that day, it was so tiring. He pretty much wore himself out that day.'

Jon Court rated Archarcharch, the sixth betting choice, in fifth, then fourth, before angling him five wide in the stretch for his winning rally.

With the Southwest victory, Archarcharch picked up \$150,000 in graded stakes earnings, which is used to determine the field for the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) if more than 20 three-year-olds are entered.

J P's Gusto turned in a solid effort in his debut for new trainer Joe Petalino in his first race since December 18, when he finished second in the CashCall Futurity (G1). The Best Pal (G2) and Del Mar Futurity (G1) winner was sent off as the 1.30-to-1 favorite and boosted his graded stakes earnings to \$540,000 with the \$50,000 check for second.—Mike Curry

Curlin, Rachel Alexandra mated at Lane's End

A pair of Jess Jackson's top racehorses mated on Monday when 2007 and 2008 Horse of the Year Curlin was bred to 2009 Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra at the Farish family's Lane's End in Versailles, Kentucky.

The expected foal will be a part of Curlin's third crop and arrive the same year the four-time Eclipse Award winner's first foals are of racing age. Curlin began his stud career in 2009, covering 131 mares at an advertised fee of \$75,000. He covered 150 mares in 2010 for an advertised fee of \$40,000, which is his advertised fee this year.

Rachel Alexandra was named Horse of the Year on the strength of five consecutive Grade 1 wins, including three against males, in the Preakness (G1), Haskell Invitational (G1), and Woodward (G1) Stakes, the latter coming against older males at Saratoga Race Course to cap a three-year-old season that also included wins in the Kentucky Oaks (G1) and Mother Goose Stakes (G1).

'Rachel Alexandra's 2009 campaign was one for the ages, one that racing fans will remember throughout time,' Jackson said. 'Curlin showed the heart of a champion in every race. He did

To Honor and Serve strong in final Fountain of Youth workout

To Honor and Serve wrapped up his serious preparation for Saturday's Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth Stakes (G2) with a swift four-furlong breeze on Sunday at Payson Park Training Center in South Florida.

The Nashua (G2) and Remsen (G2) Stakes winner was clocked in :48.20, the fastest of 23 timed moves at the distance.

To Honor and Serve was the 10.50-to-1 third choice among individual wagering interests in the first round of the Kentucky Derby Future Wager, which closed on Sunday.

As of Sunday, the potential field for the 1½-mile Fountain of Youth also included Delta Downs Jackpot Stakes (G3) winner Gourmet Dinner, graded stakes winner Soldat, Casper's Touch, Shackleford, and turf stakes winner Racing Aptitude.

On Monday, Norfolk Stakes (G1) winner Jaycito drilled seven furlongs in 1:24.80 handily at Hollywood Park in preparation for the San

Felipe Stakes (G2) on March 12 at Santa Anita Park.

Jaycito had been stabled at Santa Anita. Brad Weisbord, racing manager for owner Zayat Stables, said trainer Bob Baffert moved the Victory Gallop colt over to the synthetic Cushion Track surface at Hollywood to avoid missing any training time because of rain.

Indian Winter covered six furlongs in 1:12 handily at Santa Anita after being scratched on Sunday afternoon from the San Vicente Stakes (G2). Trainer Jerry Hollendorfer has entered the Indian Charlie colt in the Turf Paradise Derby on Saturday at 1½ miles.

Indian Winter scored by a half-length in the San Pedro Stakes at 6½ furlongs on January 17. The longest race in his three career starts was a third-place finish in the seven-furlong Del Mar Futurity (G1) on September 8.—*Jeff Lowe*

everything we asked of him and more—taking on ever-more difficult challenges. He won going away, he won coming from behind, he won in the heat and the rain.”

“The privilege of owning these horses is like lightning striking twice,” said Jackson's wife, Barbara Banke, who operates Stonestreet Thoroughbreds with her husband. “Rachel Alexandra and Curlin are true champions; both horses embody that intangible equine ideal that separate mere horse from legend. Both Jess and I are so pleased that these powerful bloodlines will pass to future generations.”

Although Rachel Alexandra capped a string of three consecutive Horse of the Year awards for Stonestreet, the Medaglia d'Oro filly probably will be forever linked with 2010 Horse of the Year Zenyatta, whom Curlin beat out for the award in 2008 and Rachel Alexandra beat out in 2009. Like Curlin, Zenyatta resides at Lane's End. She will be bred to Darley's Bernardini this year.—*Ed DeRosa*

Arlington Park

Arlington Park and the Illinois Thoroughbred Horseman's Association have reached an agreement to bank purse monies based upon the number of betting interests in all overnight races for the upcoming 2011 meet, beginning with the opening day program on May 6.

The purses listed in the condition book for overnight races will be based upon a field of seven or more betting interests at the time the horses reach the paddock for a race. Any overnight race field that enters the paddock with six or fewer betting interests represented will run for 85% of the listed purse with the remaining 15% being banked in the purse account to prevent overpayments for those races.

"In talking to our bettors, they say that field size is their single biggest driver of wagering. As such, it makes sense to base the purse of the race on the amount of wagering it generates," Arlington Park General Manager Tony Petrillo said.

Using a maiden special weight race as an example, the purse listed in the condition book would be \$28,000. Should a field of six or fewer betting interests reach the paddock for the race, the purse for the race would be adjusted to \$23,800.

Additionally, at the request of horsemen, the purse values listed in the condition book will reflect the base purse with any bonuses listed as additions rather than inclusions in the purse. Using an open maiden special weight race as an example, the purse listed will be \$28,000, plus \$10,080 in Illinois owners awards, rather than \$38,080.

Fair Grounds

Trainer **Ken McPeek** pulled off another impressive New Orleans invasion during Saturday's Louisiana Derby (G2) preview day, capturing the Rachel Alexandra Stakes (G3) with **Kathmanblu** (Bluegrass Cat), the \$60,000 Pan Zareta Stakes with **Beautician** (Dehere), and finishing third in the Risen Star Stakes (G2) with **Rogue Romance** (Smarty Jones).

"It was a good weekend," McPeek said on Monday by phone from Gulfstream Park. "All my horses came out of their races well."

McPeek said he is working to finalize plans for the next starts for those horses, with **Rogue Romance** a possible candidate for the **Louisiana Derby** on March 26 and **Kathmanblu** probable for the **Fair Grounds Oaks (G2)**.

"We are looking real seriously at bringing them both back, but nothing has been set in stone just yet," McPeek said.

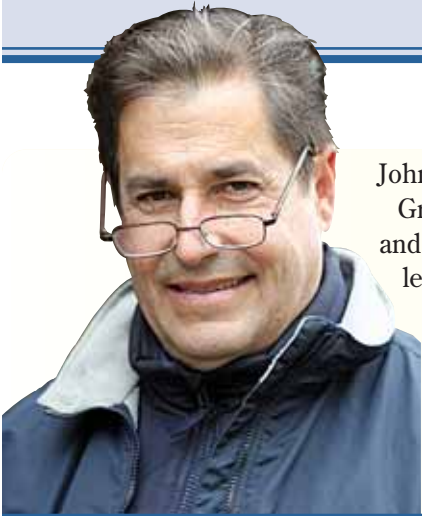

Sadler, who took out his trainer's license in 1978, said his best career accomplishment was winning the 2009 Santa Anita Derby (G1) with Sidney's Candy. He learned his trade as a veterinarian's assistant to Jack Robbins, D.V.M., and as an assistant to trainers David Hofmans and Eddie Gregson. Sadler spent five minutes with THOROUGHBRED TIMES TODAY editor Mike Curry.

What was the last movie you watched?

What do you think is the best racing movie?

Boots Malone. That's so obscure very few people will get it. William Holden is a jockey's agent. It's a classic. William Holden is a great actor, and he plays this rebel jockey's agent with a heart of gold. It kind of focuses on racetrack characters, and it's just a classic.

What was the last book you read?

Anything by John Grisham. Read 'em all; usually on an airplane. East Coast to West Coast or west to east, that's where I do most of my reading.

What is your favorite TV show?

I like "Top Chef." I can't cook but I like watching cooking.

When was your last vacation?

Last year, I took five days and we went to South Florida in the first part of December.

What was your best vacation ever?

Don't have many vacations with this kind of lifestyle. It's ahead of me, my best vacation.

Macho Uno takes on historic role

Son of Holy Bull is primary hope for perpetuation of Plaudit male line

For racing historians and pedigree enthusiasts, Macho Uno carries a heavy burden. As the only champion American son of his sire, Holy Bull, Macho Uno is one of a very few candidates to extend the historically rare male line of 1898 Kentucky Derby winner Plaudit.

With his fourth crop now only three years old, Macho Uno already has shown enough to encourage belief that the male line descending from Plaudit's paternal great-grand sire *Eclipse, by Orlando, will live on for a 14th generation since *Eclipse was imported by Richard Ten Broeck in 1859. Macho Uno's fourth-crop son, Mucho Macho Man, winner of the Risen Star Stakes (G2) on February 19, is one of Macho Uno's 14 stakes winners from 283 foals in his first four crops. His stakes winners to foals strike rate of 4.9% is in the same ballpark as his sire's lifetime percentage. There is a good chance Macho Uno's percentages may improve slightly as foals begin racing from the better mares his early success earned.

Bred in Kentucky in 1998 by Frank Stronach's Adena Springs, Macho Uno is from the fourth crop of 1994 Horse of the Year Holy Bull, one of the most brilliant runners of the 1990s. Winner of 13 of 16 starts, including the 1994 Metropolitan Handicap (G1) and Travers Stakes (G1), Holy Bull by far was the best son of Great Above, a very close relative of the immortal Dr. Fager, by Rough'n Tumble. A tall, lightly made horse, Macho Uno looked very immature at two in 2000, but held off the closing charge of Point Given in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1) to earn champion two-year-old male honors.

Nagging injuries compromised his subsequent racing career, but he proved he retained his considerable talent by winning the Pennsylvania Derby (G3) at three and the Massachusetts Handicap (G2) at four. Macho Uno was the second top-class runner out of his dam, Primal Force, by Blushing Groom (Fr), and Stronach elected to begin his stud career standing at Adena Springs South in Williston, Florida, rather than competing with his half brother, 1996 Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) winner Awesome Again, by Deputy Minister, in Kentucky.

Macho Uno sired six stakes winners from only 68 named foals in

his first crop, led by the admirably tough Macho Again (out of Go Donna Go, by Wild Again), winner of the 2009 Stephen Foster Handicap (G1) who also finished second in the 2008 Preakness Stakes (G1). That first crop also included Canadian classic winner Harlem Rocker (Freedom Come, by Lit de Justice), and 2007 Lane's End Breeders' Futurity (G1) winner Wicked Style (Devietta, by Trempolino).

Mucho Macho Man probably is Macho Uno's best runner to come along since that first crop, having finished second twice in graded stakes to To Honor and Serve as a two-year-old. His dam, Ponche de Leona, by Ponche, was a fast filly unencumbered by much of a pedigree. By the Maryland sprinter Ponche, by Two Punch, Ponche de Leona was at her best as a two-year-old in 2001, winning the Anoakia Stakes at Santa Anita Park and finishing second in the Moccasin Stakes at Hollywood Park. Third in the Palo Alto Handicap at three, Ponche de Leona raced through her six-year-old season, winning eight of 30 starts and earning \$260,870.

Ponche sired only five minor stakes winners from 133 foals, and Ponche de Leona was by far the best of 12 foals out of her dam, Perfect and Proud, by the Hoist the Flag horse Nonparrell. Perfect and Proud was a half sister to stakes-placed winner Proud Drummer, by Spanish Drums, and their dam, Gal Sal, by Blasting Signal, won the 1975 Clipsetta Stakes at Latonia Race Course.

Mucho Macho Man's fifth dam, Carolwood, by Swaps, was a pretty good broodmare from a very good family. Also the dam of 1972 Del Mar Oaks winner House of Cards, by Promised Land, Carolwood is from the family of Foundation Mare Golden Trail, by Hasty Road, and is tail-female ancestress of nine graded winners, including Grade 1 winners Prenup and Dream Empress.

Adena Springs purchased Ponche de Leona after her racing career, and sold her, carrying Mucho Macho Man, for only \$33,000 to agent John D. Rio at the 2007 Keeneland November breeding stock sale. Mucho Macho Man is Ponche de Leona's second foal, and she has since produced a yearling filly by Gottcha Gold and a 2011 filly by Chestertown Slew.


With Kentucky Derby (G1) winner Giacomo and Grade 1 winner Flashy Bull at stud in addition to Macho Uno, Holy Bull has left the Plaudit male line in much better shape than he found it. History will tell us if Macho Uno can do the same.

Cozi Rosie digs in gamely late to capture Buena Vista

As soon as Mike Smith saw that Grade 1 winner Evening Jewel would not be running in the \$150,000 Buena Vista Handicap (G2), he breathed a quick sigh of relief and knew he would have a good shot to get his mount to the winner's circle.

That is exactly what happened as Jerry and Ann Moss' Cozi Rosie made a determined bid in the lane under the Racing Hall of Fame jockey to collar Briecat and capture the one-mile turf race by 1¼ lengths, her second career graded stakes victory in her first start since May 31, 2010, when she finished second by a head to Evening Jewel in the Honeymoon Handicap (G2) at Hollywood Park.

"There was certainly a sense of relief when I saw Evening Jewel scratch out of the race," Smith said. "She's very talented and she has tactical speed. She would have been making the first run and I would have had to try and run her down."

"I'm telling you, [Cozi Rosie] has an abundance of talent. To be honest, I haven't been around her in the morning, but I'm sure glad I was on her today. She has so much room to improve. I don't know how many gears she has, but she only used a couple of them today."

Cozi Rosie chased the pace off the rail from seventh, then sixth, as multiple Grade 2 winner Briecat took the field through a half-mile in :47.44 and six furlongs in 1:11.05. Briecat took the lead into the stretch and appeared destined to find the finish line first before Smith and Cozi Rosie dug in with determination and overhauled Briecat in the final 50 yards to win, covering the distance in 1:35.94 on firm turf.

"We were happy to see the speed in there because she wants to come off the pace," trainer John Sadler said. "That's when she started to get really good last year—when she relaxed in the end and closed good."

Sadler praised the Mosses for the long layoff and the opportunity to get the four-year-old Pleasantly Perfect mare back in optimal racing form.

"She went off last year where we weren't happy with her, and the Mosses are great if you have an issue and you want to do something with a horse," Sadler said. "They tell you to do what's right every time, so that's what really makes it nice for the trainer."—*Steve Bailey*

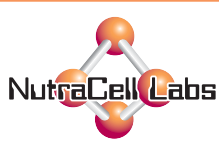

Cambina closes with powerful rush to take La Habra Stakes

Irish stakes-placed winner Cambina (Ire) made the most of her second North American start, charging with authority down the center of the stretch to prevail in the final stride for a nose victory in the \$100,000 La Habra Stakes (G3) on Monday at Santa Anita Park.

The three-year-old Hawk Wing filly won two of her five European starts with a runner-up finish in the Flame of Tara EBF Stakes in September at the Curragh last season for her former connections, trainer

Tommy Stack and owner Susan Magnier.

Cambina was purchased privately by a partnership that includes Anthony Bilich, Jason Cline, and George Schmitt and sent to the Southern California barn of Jeff Bonde. She finished sixth of ten in her North American debut in the 6½-furlong Sweet Life Stakes on the downhill turf course on January 22.

Her second attempt on the unique downhill layout proved to be much more satisfying for Bonde and jockey Garrett Gomez, who rode the diminutive filly for the first time in the 6½-furlong turf test.

"She's small, but she's got a lot of heart and she's got a heck of a turn of foot," Gomez said.

J. Paul Reddam's Quiet Oasis (Ire), who finished seventh of 14 in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (G2) in November at Churchill Downs in her previous start, appeared to have command of the race in midstretch before Gomez and Cambina made their move, powerfully gobbling up ground with each stride on the outside and crossing the finish line first, covering the distance in 1:13.75 on firm turf.

"I thought we were gonna win easy, but that filly inside of us [Quiet Oasis] kept fighting back," Gomez said. "I thought I got the bob, but she's so small and when they're so far apart it's really tough to tell who got to the wire first."—*Steve Bailey*

No Advantage holds off Laysh Laysh Laysh in General George

No Advantage gained a measure of revenge on Laysh Laysh Laysh on Monday, holding off his familiar foe by a neck to win in the \$150,000 General George Handicap (G2) at Laurel Park.

Suarez Racing's six-year-old Posse horse opened up a clear lead with a powerful move in early stretch and was fully extended to hold off the late surge of 2.80-to-1 favorite Laysh Laysh Laysh, who defeated No Advantage by 2 1/4 lengths in the one-

mile Native Dancer Stakes on January 17 at Laurel.

Cutting back to seven furlongs for trainer Stephanie Beattie, No Advantage had just enough stamina in the tank to secure his second career graded stakes and fourth stakes win overall. He covered the distance in 1:24.46 on a track rated as fast under Manuel Chaves.

With the General George victory, No Advantage improved to nine wins from 28 starts and \$481,762 in purse earnings. He won the 2009 William Donald Schaeffer Stakes (G3) on the Preakness Stakes (G1) undercard.

"This was actually better," Beattie said. "We worked really hard on this one. He just keeps going. We give him breaks here and there, like

we did lay him off for four months [last year] to give him a little freshener. That did a lot for him."

Bred in Kentucky by Viking Stud, No Advantage is out of the winning Tactical Advantage mare Prime Advantage. Pablo and Michelle Suarez's Suarez Racing went to \$50,000 to buy out two partners for No Advantage at the 2009 Keeneland November breeding stock sale. He has earned \$255,802 with three wins, five seconds, and a third in 14 starts since the sale.

Driven by Success, Taqarub, and Delauney duelled through a spirited opening quarter in :23.46 before Driven by Success dropped back a few lengths through a half-mile in :46.61. No Advantage was sixth with three furlongs remaining but closed with a rush to seize command at odds of 10.90-to-1.

"This horse normally breaks a little bit slow, so I just let him find his stride going down the backside," Chaves said. "He just gets comfortable and gets into the race and responds whenever I ask him. He's an amazing horse. He knows where that wire is. He's got an enormous amount of heart. This the best win of my career."—Mike Curry

Mucho Macho Man cemented his position as a horse to be reckoned with on the Triple Crown trail with a convincing 1½-length victory in the \$300,000 Risen Star Stakes (G2) on Saturday at Fair Grounds.

The bay Macho Uno colt stalked Decisive Moment from second and surged away from Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes (G2) winner Santiva and Liondrive entering the stretch to take charge. He covered 1½ miles in 1:43.98 on a track rated as fast.

The Risen Star victory boosted Mucho Macho Man's graded stakes earnings to \$270,000, putting him in excellent position for a starting spot in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1), which is capped at 20 starters with graded earnings used to determine the field.

Trained by Kathy Ritvo, Mucho Macho Man finished second to To Honor and Serve in both the Nashua (G2) and Remsen (G2) Stakes at two and finished fourth in the Holy Bull Stakes (G3) after he was bumped hard at the start of his three-year-old debut on January 30 at Gulfstream Park.

Ritvo said Mucho Macho Man could take his next step toward historic Churchill Downs in either the Louisiana Derby (G2) on March 26 at Fair Grounds or the Florida Derby (G1) on April 3 at Gulfstream Park.

"We're going to see how he comes back before we make plans,"

said Ritvo, who trains Mucho Macho Man for Reeves Thoroughbred Racing and Dream Team One Racing Stable. "I would love to stay home for the Florida Derby."

Bred in Florida by John D. and Carole A. Rio, Mucho Macho Man is out of the stakes-winning Ponche mare Ponche de Leona.

"He goes two miles like he's out to jog," Ritvo said. "He's just going to get better the farther the distances get. It's a great accomplishment and he's improving; he's just got to stay going two turns."

Pluck training well toward European classic target

Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (G2) winner Pluck is rounding into form nicely after a layoff following a standout two-year-old campaign, and Barry Irwin, founder and chief executive officer of co-owner Team Valor International, said he remains on target for a European classic race.

Pluck won three of five starts at two for Team Valor, including two graded stakes. While he enjoyed an extended break from his regular training regimen at the end of last season, there was a flurry of ac-

tivity around him as Irwin tabbed Fair Hill, Maryland-based trainer Graham Motion as Team Valor's trainer and transferred Pluck and the rest of his horses to Fair Hill Training Center.

During Pluck's break, Team Valor also sold an interest in the More Than Ready colt to Vinery Australia, where Pluck will stand at the operation's stallion station near Scone in New South Wales at the conclusion of his racing career.

Shortly after the Juvenile Turf, Irwin and Motion picked out the Poule d'Essai des Poulains (Fr-G1) (French Two Thousand Guineas) on May 15 at Longchamp and the Abu Dhabi Irish Two Thousand Guineas (Ire-G1) on May 21 at the Curragh as objectives for Pluck's three-year-old campaign. Irwin said no decision has been made on Pluck's main target; instead, they will wait and see how the fields for both races develop before making a decision.

"We want to run in the Irish Guineas, but if that race comes up with Frankel in it or some monster and the French race looks easier, that's our backup," said Irwin, who had a string of horses with Motion before deciding to consolidate his stable with one trainer.

"Interestingly, when we sold our interest to these guys in Australia, I told them that there were these two races and I figured that they would naturally want to run in the Irish because it has more prestige, and they told me that in Australia they thought the French was its equal. The French definitely is usually easier to win, and I think it

would suit this horse better because we want some give in the ground and they water the courses there. We'll keep an eye on it and whichever one looks like it's going to be the easiest one to win, we'll go there. But we're planning on running in the Irish race."

Team Valor bred Pluck out of South African classic-placed stakes winner Secret Heart (SAf), by Fort Wood. Irwin said he started out a bit slowly when he returned to training and showed some rust in his first couple of workouts in January, but he has really come on of late. His most recent workout was a five-furlong breeze in 1:03.90 in company with stablemate Animal Kingdom on February 18 at Palm Meadows Training Center in Boynton Beach, Florida.

"He got a little bit fat because we didn't do anything with him for six or seven weeks," Irwin said. "We've been working him with a horse called Animal Kingdom. The first couple of times Animal Kingdom was stronger, and then the next couple of times they were even, and the last few times Pluck was very good; let's put it that way. He's doing great."

Animal Kingdom, a Leroidesanimaux (Brz) colt, finished second in his debut in September at Arlington Park before winning his second start at Keeneland Race Course in October. Both races were on the synthetic Polytrack surface, and Irwin said he plans to point Animal Kingdom to the Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (G1) on April 16 at Keeneland.

"We're going to run him in the Blue Grass. I think he's a pretty good horse and it's good to have a workmate like that so we can get a pretty good gauge on him."—Mike Curry

Trainer Mike de Kock looks to have a formidable pair for Thursday's **United Arab Emirates Oaks (UAE-G1)** at Meydan Racecourse in Etisalat United Arab Emirates One Thousand Guineas winner **Mahbooba** (Galileo [Ire]) and runner-up **Reem** (Galileo [Ire]).

De Kock won the Oaks last year with **Raihana** (Elusive Quality). Reem defeated Mahbooba by a half-length in a One Thousand Guineas trial on January 13 and, after her runner-up finish in the Guineas, she finished second against older fillies and mares in the Balanchine sponsored by Emirates NBD (UAE-G2) on February 18.

Mahbooba, South Africa's 2009-2010 champion two-year-old filly, has won four of six starts, including the 2010 Golden Slipper (SAf-G1).
