The Factor holds off Sway Away to take San Vicente

The Factor proved in his previous start that he was lightning quick. In his third career start, he showed he has heart to go along with his freakish speed.

The three-year-old War Front colt, who set a track record at Santa Anita Park for six furlongs on December 26 in his second start, showed

he could withstand challenges both early and late as he held off a bid by Sway Away in deep stretch to capture the \$150,000 San Vicente Stakes (G2) on Sunday at the Arcadia, California, track.

"It's hard to get a horse like this," trainer Bob Baffert said. "They don't come around very often ... he'll benefit from this race.

"I knew it was going to be a really fast pace. The more I looked at the race, we were right in between the two speed horses, and I was afraid they would leave there and try to put the squeeze on him ... and that was the only way we he could get beat, was if they put the squeeze on him and he had to check him and take him back."

As expected, The Factor

J P's Gusto debuts for new trainer Petalino in Southwest

J P's Gusto will race outside of California for the first time today at Oaklawn Park as he embarks upon the Triple Crown trail with a new trainer in the \$250,000 Southwest Stakes (G3).

Trainer Joe Petalino, a former assistant to Racing Hall of Fame trainer Jack Van Berg and exercise rider of dual classic winner Alysheba, took over conditioning duties from David Hofmans for owner Gem Inc. The Successful Appeal ridgling will make his three-year-old debut in the one-mile race.

"He came to me with four works already in him," Petalino said after his final workout for the Southwest. "He's hasn't missed any time so he's pretty much ready. He's doing pretty good here and he seems to like the track."

Regardless of today's outcome, J P's Gusto has a starting spot in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) sealed up with \$490,000 in graded stakes earnings after a standout juvenile campaign.

J P's Gusto posted wins in the Del Mar Futurity (G1), Best Pal Stakes (G2), and Hollywood Juvenile Championship Stakes (G3) last season. He also finished second to Comma to the Top in the CashCall Futurity (G1) to conclude his two-year-old season.

While the extra graded earnings would be a welcome addition, how J P's Gusto performs in the two-turn race and how he progresses as a three-year-old probably will tell Gem Inc. if they have a Derby contender in their stable. Petalino also will send out multiple stakes-placed winner Brickyard Fast.

Dual stakes winner Caleb's Posse enters off a dominant showing

the one-mile Smarty Jones Stakes at Oaklawn on January 17, winning by 2 1/4 lengths for trainer Donnie Von Hemel.

The Posse colt won three of six starts as a two-year-old, including the Clever Trevor Stakes at Remington Park.

Sugar Bowl Stakes winner Archarcharch will try to rebound from a lackluster fourth-place finish in the Smarty Jones.

Larry Jones, who returned to training this season after about a 15-month retirement, will enter Brereton Jones' homebred Yankee Passion. The Yankee Gentleman colt enters off a strong 2 1/4-length win in a six-furlong optional claiming race on January 27 at Oaklawn.

Calvin Borel, fresh off winning the Meydan Masters jockey competition in Dubai, picks up the mount on Elite Alex. Trained by Tim Ritchey, Elite Alex enters off a runner-up finish on January 15 at Oaklawn.—Tim Nichols

Coa has movement in upper body, feeling throughout

Jockey Eibar Coa has some movement in his arms and shoulders with feeling throughout his body following surgery on Saturday to repair a broken C4 vertebra.

According to his agent, Tito Fuentes, Coa has no movement in his legs but remains in good spirits. He is scheduled to undergo a second surgery today or Tuesday at Memorial Regional Hospital in Hollywood, Florida.

Coa was unseated when his mount, Lady Chesterfield, tripped over another horse and fell after the finish of the sixth race on Friday at Gulfstream Park.

"As of now, he can move his arms and he can feel everything," Fuentes said on Sunday morning. "He just

can't move everything, but that isn't to say that won't change."

Coa, who turned 40 on February 15, has won more than 4,000 races in his professional career, which began in 1993. A Venezuela native, Coa won his first Breeders' Cup race last season when he guided Big Drama to a win in the Sentient Jet Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1).

Jockey Paco Lopez, who sustained a left elbow injury in the spill, visited Gulfstream on Saturday and presented the trophy after the 21st edition of the Sabin Stakes (G3). Lopez, who had his left arm in a sling, said he was sore but feeling well.

Jockey agent Cory Moran said Lopez suffered a "little chip" in his elbow. Doctors do not believe Lopez will need surgery, but Moran said the jockey will visit a specialist on Monday for further evaluation and to determine when Lopez can return to riding.

Breeders' Cup Challenge series expands to Japan

The Takarazuka Kinen (Jpn-G1) has joined the international Breeders' Cup Challenge "Win and You're In" program, a global series of stakes races in which winners earn automatic starting spots to the Breeders' Cup World Championships.



The winner of the Takarazuka Kinen, which will be run at 2,200 meters (10.94 furlongs) on the turf for three-year-olds and older on June 26 at Hanshin Racecourse, will earn a guaranteed berth in the \$3-million Emirates Airline Breeders' Cup Turf (G1), which will be run at 1½ miles on the turf.

As part of the enhanced benefits program for Breeders' Cup Challenge winners introduced this year, the Breeders' Cup will pay the entry fee of \$90,000 and a travel allowance of \$20,000 to the winner of the Takarazuka Kinen to start in the Breeders' Cup Turf. The winner must be nominated to the Breeders' Cup by the pre-entry deadline of October 24 to receive the rewards.

"We are very pleased that the Takarazuka Kinen has become the first-ever Japanese race to be a part of the Breeders' Cup Challenge series, and we are delighted to join with so many other outstanding races from around the world in the program," said Dr. Kenji Tsuchikawa, president of the Japan Racing Association.

In addition to Japan, Breeders' Cup Challenge races this year will be held in the U.S., Canada, Hong Kong, England, Ireland, France, Argentina, and Australia. The complete 2011 Breeders' Cup Challenge schedule will be announced in March.

Uncle Mo breezes at Palm Meadows

Champion Uncle Mo continued to work in preparation for his season debut with a five-furlong workout on Sunday at Palm Meadows Training Center in South Florida for trainer Todd Pletcher.

The unbeaten Indian Charlie colt breezed five-eighths of a mile in 1:01.40, which ranked seventh of 22 timed moves at the distance. Uncle Mo is under consideration for the 1½-mile Tampa Bay Derby (G2) or the Timely Writer Stakes at Gulfstream Park, both on March 12. The Timely Writer Stakes is a one-turn mile.

Repole Stable's Uncle Mo capped an unbeaten two-year-old season with back-to-back wins in the Champagne Stakes (G1) and Grey Goose Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1) en route to the Eclipse Award as champion two-year-old male.

Pletcher also sent out stablemates Stay Thirsty, Cal Nation, and Travelin Man for planned workouts at Palm Meadows. Three Chimneys Hopeful Stakes (G1) runner-up Stay Thirsty, who is being pointed to the Gotham Stakes (G3) on March 5, breezed five furlongs in 1:00.65.

Cal Nation, an impressive 7¼-length debut winner on February 5 at Gulfstream, breezed an easy half-mile in :50. Travelin Man, who won his first career start by 7¼ lengths for Pletcher on January 6 at Gulfstream, breezed a half-mile in :48.40, tied for fourth from 40 timed workouts at the distance.

Multiple stakes winner and Holy Bull Stakes (G3) runner-up Sweet Ducky breezed a bullet five furlongs in :59.50 on Sunday at Palm Meadows for trainer Kelly Breen. Breen also sent out debut winner Nacho Business for a four-furlong bullet workout in :47, tops from 40 timed moves at the distance. —Mike Curry



Handle up 27.1% for first Derby Future Wager

Total wagering handle rose 27.1% for the first of three Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) future wagers, including a 24.5% increase in win-only wagering compared with the first pool last year.

Churchill Downs Inc. reported that \$480,375 was wagered in the win pool compared with \$385,995 last year. The combined handle for win and exacta wagering rose from \$466,048 in 2010 to \$592,492 when wagering closed on Sunday. The Pool 1 betting total is the second-largest single pool total in Future Wager history, trailing only the \$620,362 wagered during the opening pool in 2005.

The mutual field option that includes all other horses not listed among the 23 individual wagering interests was the overwhelming 2.10-to-1 favorite with unbeaten champion Uncle Mo checking in next at 3.60-to-1. Holy Bull Stakes (G3) winner Dialed In drew plenty of interest at 8.40-to-1, followed by Remsen (G2) and Nashua (G2) Stakes winner To Honor and Serve at 10.50-to-1. —Mike Curry

Keertana wins The Very One with explosive finish

Barbara Hunter's Keertana flashed her closing kick on Sunday under a well-timed ride by Jose Lezcano, inhaling pacesetter and 2010 Chilean Horse of the Year Belle Watling (Chi) in early stretch and holding off a spirited challenge from 24.40-to-1 longshot Zapparition to win The Very One Stakes (G3) at Gulfstream Park.

The five-year-old Johar mare, a multiple Grade 3 winner who rarely fails to run a competitive race, Keertana was particularly impressive in The Very One. Sent off as the 2.60-to-1 third betting choice in a field of five fillies and mares, she patiently stalked Belle Watling through dawdling fractions before coming alive at the top of the stretch.

Making her North American debut and riding a ten-race winning streak that included five Group 1 wins in her native Chile, 8-to-5 second betting choice Belle Watling galloped through six furlongs in 1:20.07 with minimal pressure from Keertana and 2010 The Very One winner Changing Skies (Ire), who settled in third along the rail.

Zapparition made a sweeping move into contention as the field passed the quarter pole, but Keertana responded aggressively under Lezcano's cue and surged past Belle Watling, who had no response when confronted.

Zapparition gamely battled Keertana through the stretch, but Keertana dug deep and pulled ahead in the final strides to prevail by a half-length. She completed the 1 $\frac{1}{8}$ -mile race in 2:19.33 on firm turf.

showed an abundance of early speed, hustling to the front under pressure from City Cool and Premier Pegasus. The Factor led his five challengers through a quarter-mile in a blazing :22.20 and a half-mile in an even speedier :43.41 under jockey Martin Garcia.

Inching away from Premier Pegasus in early stretch, The Factor looked to be on his way to an easy victory before maiden winner Sway Away, the runner-up to J P's Gusto in the Best Pal Stakes (G2) on August 8 at Del Mar in his previous outing, charged powerfully home down the center of the track. Sway Away made things interesting but could not overtake the winner.

The Factor won his second career start by 8 $\frac{1}{4}$ lengths in a six-furlong track record time of 1:06.98 for owners Fog City Stables and George Bolton. He scored by three-quarters of a length in the San Vicente, covering seven furlongs in 1:20.34 on a track rated wet fast.

"He has a lot of speed and I know that the horse inside of me had a lot of speed, too," Garcia said. "I just let him break by himself. The more you fight, the more he's going to take off. He doesn't want to be behind horses, so I just let him be comfortable and he kept going.

"He is still learning. This is only the third time he has been out. I think the more that he runs, the better he will get. I don't think any horse can keep up with him, as fast as he went."

Jeff Bonde, who trains Sway Away, was just as impressed with his colt's effort.

"It's heartbreaking to lose, but that's the way the game goes," Bonde said. "This horse is the best [Kentucky] Derby (G1) chance I've had in many years. He probably could have used one more work and he maybe got back a little too far today, but he showed me enough that I'm still a believer in him."

Baffert said he will let The Factor dictate when and where he will start next.

The Factor is one of five winners from seven starters out of the Miswaki mare Greyciousness, a half sister to 1999 Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1) winner Chief Seattle.—*Steve Bailey*

"I was a little worried that we were going so slow," Lezcano said. "I really didn't know how good the horse on the lead [Belle Watling] was ... the main thing was I didn't want to move too early. Zapparition came up to me around the turn, and my horse was very game in the stretch."

Musical Rain (Ire) finished 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ lengths behind Zapparition in third, besting a fading Belle Watling and Changing Skies, who turned in a disappointing effort as the 6-to-5 favorite.

Trained by Tom Proctor, Keertana has been the model of consistency since scoring her first stakes win in the 2009 Regret Stakes (G3), winning the Glens Falls Handicap (G3) in 2010 and placing in six other graded stakes during 2009 and 2010. She finished third, beaten by a half-length by Shared Account, in the Emirates Airline Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf (G1) on November 5 at Churchill Downs.

Keertana is out of the unraced Storm Cat mare Motokiks and is a half sister to 2010 Garden City Stakes (G1) runner-up Snow Top Mountain.—*Patrick Reed*

Reeves Thoroughbred Racing and Dream Team One Racing Stable

Mucho Macho Man established his credentials as a serious contender for the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) with a 1½-length victory under Rajiv Maragh in the 1¼-mile Risen Star Stakes (G2) on Saturday at Fair Grounds.

The win lifted the Macho Uno colt's graded stakes earnings to \$270,000, which puts him in powerful position to guarantee a starting spot in the Derby field, which is capped at 20 starters with graded earnings used to determine the field if oversubscribed.

His owners and trainer Kathy Ritvo dedicated his Risen Star win to injured regular rider Eibar Coa, who fractured the C4 vertebra in his back in a frightening spill at Gulfstream on Friday. Coa has regained movement in his hands and feeling throughout his body after surgery on Saturday at Memorial Regional Hospital in Hollywood, Florida.

Ritvo said on Sunday that Mucho Macho Man came out of the victory in good order.

"Kathy prepared him brilliantly and Rajiv gave him a great ride," Hatzikoutelis said. "I know that even from his hospital bed, Eibar was cheering us on and he was with us at the Fair Grounds.

"We feel this is a very special horse and he has made all of us very proud. Two turns certainly made the difference for us and the added distance set us up well."

Bred in Kentucky by Stonerside Stable, It's Tricky is the first starter out of graded stakes winner Catboat, by Tale of the Cat.

Lane's End stallion and 2003 Horse of the Year Mineshaft picked up his milestone 20th stakes winner with It's Tricky's Busher score. Mineshaft, who stands for \$25,000 at Lane's End in Versailles, Kentucky, also has a top Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) contender in unbeaten Holy Bull Stakes (G3) winner Dialed In.—Mike Curry

Quiet Giant continues to roll for Evans estate

Quiet Giant made short work of the Rare Treat Stakes on Sunday at Aqueduct, capturing her third consecutive stakes and continuing to shine the spotlight on her late owner and breeder.

Edward P. Evans died on December 31 at age 68. Evans operated

Spring Hill Farm in Casanova, Virginia, and had a long-standing relationship with William S. Farish's Lane's End, where 2005 Horse of the Year Saint Liam stood before his death and multiple Grade 1 winner Quality Road will begin his stud career this year. Evans bred both horses in Virginia and raced Quality Road.

Quiet Giant, a four-year-old Evans homebred by Giant's Causeway, began the unbeaten streak about three weeks before Evans' death, winning the Cheap Seats Stakes by 8¾ lengths. She followed with a three-length victory in the Lady on the Run Stakes on January 16 prior to her commanding nine-length victory in the Rare Treat Stakes.

Quiet Giant, who has won five of eight starts and earned \$172,050, is one of eight winners from as many starters out of the Grade 2-placed stakes-winning Quiet American mare Quiet Dance. Quiet Giant is a half sister to Saint Liam, Grade 3 winner and sire Congressionalhonor, and stakes winner Dance Quietly.

Evans was born in Pittsburgh and followed his father, the late Thomas Mellon Evans, into the breeding and racing business. The elder Evans bred and raced 1981 champion three-year-old male and dual classic winner Pleasant Colony and owned Buckland Farm.

Since beginning to breed and race after establishing Spring Hill in 1969, Evans has bred more than 100 stakes winners and annually bred about 80 mares each year.—Steve Bailey

"We're going to see how he comes back before we make plans," Ritvo said. "I would love to stay home for the Florida Derby (G1) [on April 3]."
